

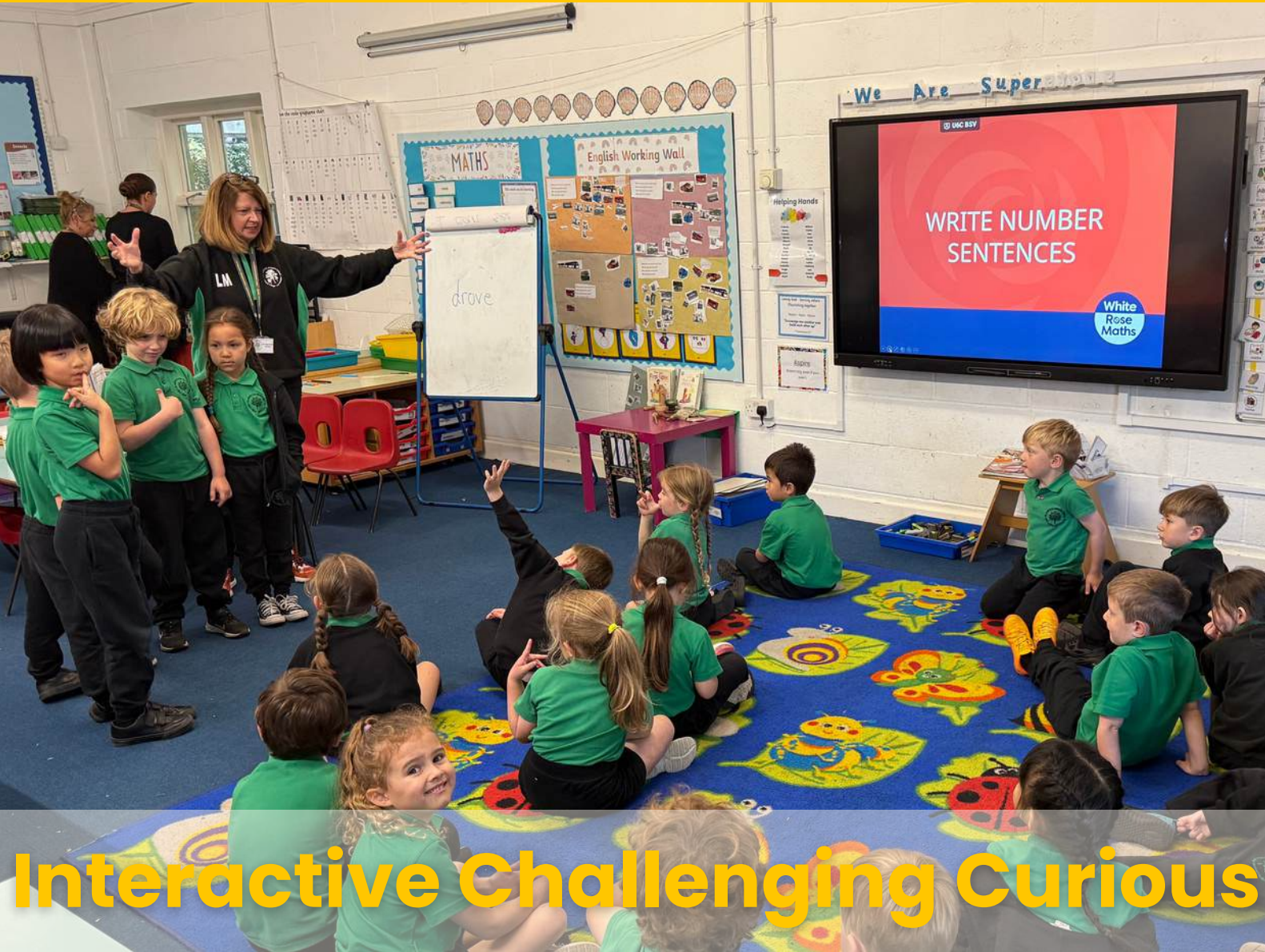

The Importance of Attendance and Punctuality

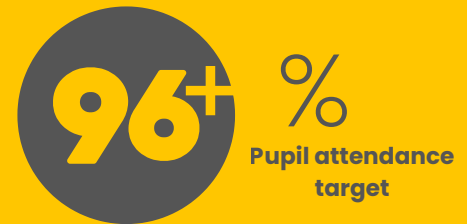
At St. Mark's, we believe that good attendance and punctuality are essential for every child's success. Arriving at school on time sets the tone for the day, helps children settle into their routine, and ensures they don't miss out on valuable learning time.



School start times

Doors open: 8:30am

Doors close: 8:40am



To be marked on time, students must be in school before the bell at 8:40am.

Late Arrivals

8:40am – 8:50am: Pupils arriving during this time will need to be signed in on our sign in system in the Office by an adult and will receive a Late mark (L) on the register.

After 8:50am: Pupils arriving after this time will need to be signed in on our sign in system in the Office by an adult and will be marked as Late after register closes (U), which is classed as an unauthorised absence unless a valid reason is provided.

Why It Matters

Regular lateness can add up to a significant amount of lost learning time over the year. Being just 10 minutes late each day equates to nearly 33 hours of lost learning over the school year – that's almost a whole week of school missed!

Arriving on time

Helps children feel more confident and ready to learn.

Encourages responsibility and routine.

Avoids disruption to the class and ensures all students start the day together.

We appreciate your support in helping your child develop good habits for life. Let's work together to make every school day count!

If you are experiencing difficulties with getting to school on time, please don't hesitate to contact the school office – we're here to help.

Heads Matter: Wearing Helmets

Whether they're learning in the classroom or riding their bikes and scooters to and from school, they are acting as role models and ambassadors for our school.

The safety of our children is always a top priority.

One simple but vital piece of safety gear can make all the difference: a helmet.

Why Helmets Matter

Head injuries can be serious, and even a minor fall can lead to a concussion or worse if a helmet isn't worn. Helmets are specially designed to protect the skull and brain from injury by absorbing impact.

Wearing a helmet:

Reduces the risk of serious head injury by up to 85%
Encourages safe habits that can last a lifetime
Sets a positive example for friends and siblings



When Should Helmets Be Worn?

Helmets should be worn every time a child rides a:

Bicycle

Scooter

Skateboard

Rollerblades or similar wheels

This includes riding to and from school, during after-school play, or at the skate park.

A Good Helmet Should:

Fit snugly and sit level on the head

Have adjustable straps that form a "V" under the ears

Be worn flat—not tipped back or forwards

Meet safety standards (look for CE or similar certification marks)

Set the Standard – Be a Role Model

We encourage all families to make helmet use a consistent part of riding. Children are more likely to wear helmets when adults do, too!

Let's work together to ensure all our students travel safely—every journey, every time.

Boiler Update

We wanted to share some important news about a major improvement we have recently made to our school.



Over the past couple of months we have had to replace our school's old and unreliable boilers with three brand-new, energy efficient ones.

The work was essential to ensure that our classrooms remain warm, safe and comfortable for our pupils and staff, especially as we head into the colder months.

The total cost of this vital project was **£50,000**, a significant but necessary investment in the wellbeing of our school community. While we have managed to cover the immediate costs, this has placed a considerable strain on our school budget.

We are therefore reaching out to ask for your support. If you are able to make a voluntary donation of any size, it would make a real difference and help us recover some of these costs. Every contribution will go directly towards maintaining and improving our school facilities for all our children.

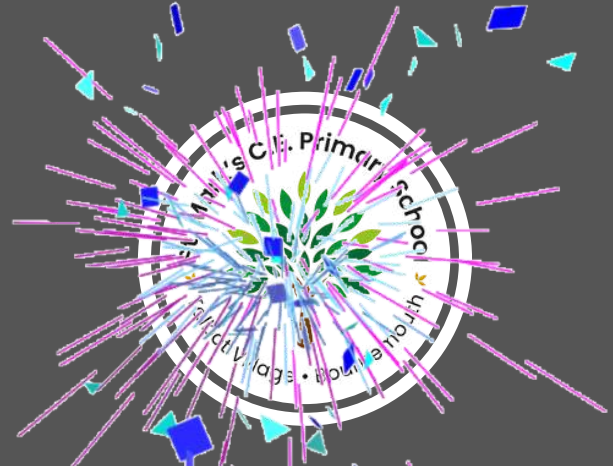

Children's Media Literacy Report

Ofcom have released their latest annual report and, as ever, it's a really interesting one and one that I think is very useful for schools. This is because it gives a comprehensive overview of the online lives of children and young people where we can see any current, new and emerging trends.

For example: An increase in 3-5 year olds using social media - this is one that always shocks people, but this is a trend that has been increasing year on year. The numbers have risen again this year to around 4 in 10 very young children using social media apps. Of those, around a fifth of their parents say their children are allowed to use social media independently. Very worrying.

Awareness of recommendation systems (algorithms) has increased this year - great news, this is one of my biggest concerns.

Half of 8-17 year olds are using AI tools - no surprise here and reflects what is seen in senior schools, solidifying the fact that we need to be teaching the safe and appropriate use of these tools whilst raising staff awareness.

There are so many apps with different reporting functions, organisations, helplines and more it can be really frustrating for parents to get help. Internet Matters have a really useful page which details some of these organisations and what they can do, how to report specific issues, how to report on many of the social platforms and games and where to go for more help.
