We hope you've now received your welcome email from Arbor and have been able to log in successfully. Arbor will be replacing Wisepay from the start of the new academic year, and it's important that all parents are set up and ready to use the new system between now and September. Please contact the school office if you haven't been able to log in, as this is the only way you will be able to make bookings for anything school related.

From July 24 2025, Wisepay will no longer be in use. All payments and bookings—including school meals, clubs, trips, and wraparound care—will be managed through Arbor. These will be set up over the summer and we will send out communications when this is ready to use.

SPEECH AND LANGUAGE



SUPPORTING CHILDREN'S SPEECH AND LANGUAGE IS NOT JUST ABOUT HELPING THEM TALK—IT'S ABOUT GIVING THEM THE TOOLS TO THINK, LEARN, AND CONNECT WITH OTHERS

Questioning

Questions are useful for checking understanding, encouraging discussion, and developing reasoning skills. However, too many questions can feel overwhelming.

- Use open ended questions to encourage more talking.
- Offer choices to support children who feel under pressure or need help with understanding.
- Always consider the purpose of your question.

Thinking time

After asking a question or giving information, pause and give your child time to think.

Some children may need up to 10 seconds to process and respond. Giving them space allows for more thoughtful and confident answers.

Wonder aloud

Use indirect questions that invite a response – but don't demand one. Try phrases like:

- "I wonder how your shoes got so dirty..."
- "Let me think how we can make this work."

This approach reduces pressure and encourages your child to share their ideas.

Did you know some children may need up to 10 seconds to answer a question?

Model speech

Instead of correcting your child when they make a mistake, repeat back what they said using the correct words while keeping the conversation going.

For example:

Child: "I goed to the farm."

Adult: "Yes, we went to the farm. We went on the tractor."

Hearing the correct version naturally helps children learn language patterns.

Building their skills

Extend your child's language by adding new words or phrases to what they say.

Example:

Child: "We planted a tomato plant."

Adult: "We did! We planted a tomato plant in the vegetable patch."

Children need to hear new words multiple times before they feel confident using them themselves.

We are here to help

If you have any concerns about your child's speech and language development, please talk to your child's class teacher.

There are lots of resources available to support your child and we have a link NHS Speech and Language Therapist to ask for advice.

ASMR – mindful or weird? Making Online Viewing Safer for Children

Have you heard of ASMR videos? I've heard about ASMR (autonomous sensory meridian response) through conversations with my children.

It might seem strange that I am including ASMR in this online safety update. However, after a recent report from Revealing Reality, and after watching a couple of videos, I don't mind admitting I felt really uncomfortable, which apparently is normal for someone over the age of 45!

What Is ASMR?

ASMR (Autonomous Sensory Meridian Response) refers to a tingling, relaxing sensation that some people experience when exposed to certain triggers like soft whispering, tapping, brushing sounds, or slow, methodical movements (like hair brushing or slime squishing).

Why Do Young People Watch ASMR?

Stress relief: Many children and teens use ASMR to unwind or self-soothe, especially if they feel overstimulated or anxious.

Connection and comfort: Some viewers turn to ASMR videos because they feel isolated or lonely, and these videos mimic comforting personal attention.

Sensory regulation: For neurodivergent individuals (e.g., those with autism or ADHD), ASMR may help regulate sensory input or provide a calming routine.

Why Is There Concern?

Your discomfort is completely valid — especially when it comes to safeguarding young people. While ASMR can be harmless or even beneficial, there are real reasons to keep a cautious eye;

Over-dependence: Some young people might turn to ASMR content in place of real-life relationships or social interaction.

Sexualized content: Some creators blur the line between ASMR and adult content, using suggestive whispering, roleplay, or visuals that can be inappropriate — especially for younger viewers.

Algorithm exposure: Platforms like YouTube and TikTok might recommend more extreme or questionable content the more a child watches, especially if parental controls aren't active.

The Revealing Reality report highlights these blurred boundaries and how easily a seemingly innocent video can shift into something darker — often without the viewer realizing.

What Is Kick Streaming?

Kick is a newer live-streaming platform launched in 2022, seen as a less restrictive alternative to Twitch (which is owned by Amazon).

Key Facts About Kick

Age restriction: 13+, like most platforms.

Focus: Similar to Twitch (gaming, chat, entertainment).

Concerns:

Much less moderation than Twitch.

Higher tolerance for adult or explicit content.

Gambling and provocative content are more visible, which raises major concerns for underage viewers.

Streamers can monetize quickly, which may incentivize risky or edgy behavior to gain views.

The fact that Kick is becoming more popular among younger audiences — despite these risks — makes it one to watch closely from an online safety perspective.

What Can Parents & Educators Do?

Watch a few ASMR videos together and ask how it makes them feel — open the conversation.

Use parental controls on YouTube, TikTok, and gaming platforms.

Talk about healthy habits for relaxation and connection.
