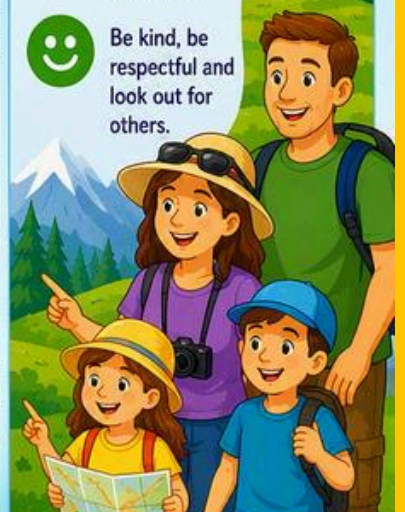

Pool Update

We are pleased to report that all planned contractor works to the swimming pool have now been completed, marking a significant milestone in the reinstatement project.

As part of the Swimming & Pool Association's long-standing aspiration to further enhance the facility, additional upgrade works will continue over the summer, including the complete replacement of the poolside flooring and associated redecoration. These improvements will help ensure a refreshed and improved environment for all users.

During the final stages of the project, however, an issue was identified with the swimming pool boiler, which has subsequently been condemned and will require replacement. We are currently obtaining quotations and exploring the most effective solution to address this unforeseen issue. Whilst this will have an impact on the reopening timetable, we are making every effort to progress matters as quickly as possible. We will provide a further update, including a confirmed reopening date, as soon as more information becomes available.

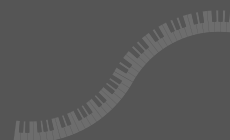

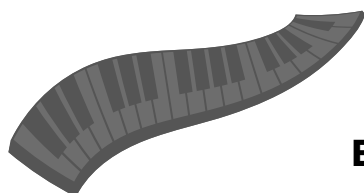

Mobile Phones in School



St Mark's CE Primary School fully complies with the new Department for Education's guidance Mobile phones in schools.

We are a phone-free school and have operated this approach successfully for several years. Pupils are not permitted to access or use mobile phones during the school day.

Mobile phones may only be brought to school where they are essential for a child's personal safety when travelling to and from school. In these circumstances:

- parental permission must be obtained in advance;**
- phones must be handed directly to the school office before the start of the school day;**
- phones are securely stored by the school throughout the day;**
- phones may only be collected once pupils have been dismissed at the end of the school day or after an authorised after-school club.**

At no point should a pupil have a mobile phone in their possession, bag or locker whilst in school. Any phone found in school will be confiscated and must be collected by a parent or carer.

We would strongly encourage parents and carers to consider delaying the purchase of a smartphone for their child. Where a mobile phone is needed for safety reasons, we recommend a simple phone capable of making calls and sending text messages, rather than a smartphone. This enables children to remain contactable when travelling to and from school whilst reducing exposure to social media, online risks and unnecessary distractions.

These arrangements ensure that mobile phones are not used during the school day and support a calm, safe and focused learning environment.



E-SAFETY

TOP TIPS FOR STAYING SAFE ONLINE



BE KIND

Treat others how you would like to be treated.
Remember that words online can hurt.



KEEP PERSONAL INFORMATION PRIVATE

Don't share your full name, address, school or passwords online. Ask a trusted adult if you're unsure.



THINK BEFORE YOU SHARE

Once something is online, it can be hard to remove.
Ask yourself: "Would I be happy for anyone to see this?"



TALK TO A TRUSTED ADULT

If you see something that upsets you or you're unsure about something online, tell a trusted adult straight away.



BALANCE IS IMPORTANT

Take breaks, get active and spend time with family and friends. There's a whole world to enjoy offline too!



RESPECT COPYRIGHT

Use music, images and other content legally and give credit where it's due. Be creative and original!



CONVERSATION STARTERS

Simple questions to start a chat with your child:

- What are your favourite apps or games at the moment?
- Who do you chat to or play online with?
- Have you ever seen something online that upset you?
- What do you do if you see something that worries you?
- How can we make sure your screen time is balanced?



You don't need all the answers – just an open conversation.

Positive Progress for SEND Services Across BCP

Following the communication to schools recognising our contribution to the progress made across SEND services in Bournemouth, Christchurch and Poole, we also wanted to update parents and carers on this important milestone. We know that positive change is only possible through the collective efforts of children, young people, families, schools and partners working together.

We are pleased to share that the Department for Education has recognised the positive progress being made to improve support for children and young people with SEND across Bournemouth, Christchurch and Poole.

As a result, the government has stepped down its statutory direction for the BCP SEND Local Area Partnership to an Improvement Notice. This reflects growing confidence in the work taking place across education, health and care services to strengthen support for children and young people with SEND.

This is an important milestone and recognises the collective efforts of schools, settings, partners, children, young people and families who have worked together to drive improvements across the local area. We would like to thank everyone who has contributed to this progress.

While we welcome this recognition, we know that improvement is an ongoing journey. We recognise that some children, young people and families continue to face challenges, and that not everyone will yet have experienced the positive changes being made. We remain committed to ensuring that improvements are felt consistently by all those who rely on SEND services and support.

The move to an Improvement Notice acknowledges the progress that has been made so far and provides encouragement that we are moving in the right direction. At the same time, it reinforces the importance of continuing to build on this progress and embed lasting improvements across the local area. Our focus remains on delivering better experiences and outcomes for children and young people with SEND.

The voices of children, young people, parents and carers will continue to be at the heart of this work. Your experiences, feedback and insights are invaluable in helping us understand what is working well and where we can do better. By continuing to work together, we can build on the foundations already in place and shape services that better meet the needs of local families.

Thank you to all parents and carers who continue to share their experiences and help shape local SEND services. Your feedback plays a vital role in our ongoing improvement work, and we remain committed to listening, learning and working in partnership with you as we continue this journey.

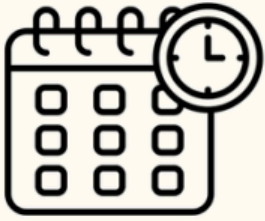

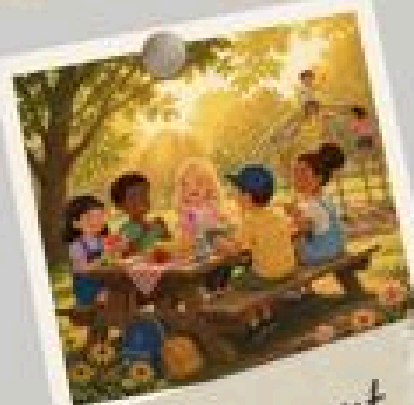

The discos are at risk - and only you can save them.

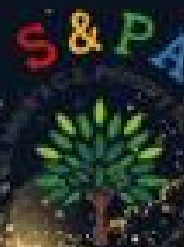
